Imagine Belfast: Festival of Ideas and Politics 2022. <u>Drawing the Ring of Steel</u> was a 1-day performative design intervention; a memorial presented to those who endured the 'Troubles' (a 30-year ethno-nationalist conflict) in Belfast Northern Ireland1969-98.

The success of this years-long, urban-scale, commemorative design project required that I undertake painstaking historical research, delicate negotiations with local political parties and security forces, then the development of a Belfast-based team of collaborators (<u>Paula McFetridge</u>, Kabosh Theatre, James Bamford, Northern Mapping & Deirdre Robb, Belfast Exposed Gallery).

On March 24th, 2022, **Drawing the Ring of Steel** took place in central Belfast after two years of Covid-related delays. The event coincided with the 50th anniversary of the Belfast security cordon's original construction and the imposition of Direct Rule by the British Government in 1972. The project was funded by the U.S. State Department \$10,000, 2020, the Republic of Ireland's Department of Foreign Affairs (DfA) €14,000 matching grant, 2021, and Belfast City Council (BCC) £10,000, 2022. DfA and BCC grants were necessarily co-written with local partner Kabosh Theatre because I am an America national; I authored the State Department grant independently.

- 2019-2021 "Reilly Park: Social, Emotional Learning Garden for All". This community-based research & design/construction project converted an underused portion of parkland with proximity to Reilly Elementary School into a publicly accessible garden in an area underserved by green space. The project also uncovered that the school had fenced off the shared-use neighborhood park over time, and the design intervention enabled local inhabitants to reclaim access to a portion of their park. The new "Reilly Gardens" community park officially opened in May, 2021. The project was initiated, codesigned & managed by Alyson Beaton and Kate Catterall in partnership with Kerri-Anne Duffy, a Reilly Elementary School teacher. The project was funded by a \$130,000 St. David's Foundation "Parks with a Purpose" award; grant written by Alyson Beaton and Kate Catterall. We worked in close partnership with AISD Ed Fund, the City of Austin & St. David's Foundation for the duration of the project, and utilized a portion of the grant to provide internship opportunities to three University of Texas and one Texas A&M student. Nurturing the gardens year-round has encouraged multigenerational learning in the space. The park/garden has not only reclaimed the right of residents of the Highland neighborhood to use AISD land for recreational purposes and helped remedy the lack of Austin Park and Recreation District (PARD) parklands in the neighborhood, but also has become a tool in Reilly School's/AISD's social and emotional learning curriculum.

TEACHING INNOVATIONS

I have team-taught a number of experimental courses with colleagues from other colleges exposing design students to the opportunities and challenges of such collaborations. I believe in constructing experiential learning opportunities for undergraduate students, through thematic course that negotiate contemporary social issues, for example: Texas S.B 11, Fast Fashion, and Higher Education in Texas. Thematic courses are labor-intensive because of they are situated in current events and crises, they necessitate an extensive list of guest lectures so that students can become familiar with the content and are situated to design quickly.

Those intense four-week courses were some of the most rewarding teaching experiences of my career.

2005+ **Design in Context: Milan** (2005-18) A biennial course. Students learned about the history of Italian product, architecture and design culture through preliminary presentations and discussions with me at our base in the Cattolica University, then embarked on travels of Milan and surrounding towns. We visited archives, factories, notable buildings, design studios, exhibitions, design schools and special talks that included lectures by Andrea Branzi, Clino Castelli Trini, Ezio Manzini, Paolo Antonelli and John Thackara. Discoveries were internalized through the design of a series of small projects that the students completed on site. The students contributed to a course blog for the last couple of years and uploaded some great comments and images.
